Mosey, One of a Kind

On a cold January night in 2018, a foster's husband caught a 'flash of kitten eyes' on the back porch just before the kitten jumped the wall. This foster does Trap Neuter Return in the area. Trap set, she waited. Sure enough, between 2 and 4 am in the morning, Mosey hopped in for some real cat food. He mewed, the foster reached through the trap to rub his head, and the non-stop purring began.

Only 6-8 weeks old, Mosey's head, chest, neck and back were matted with engine grease, his skin broken and raw from being pulled so tight by the hard gunky clumps. Boy he was gassy and smelled like a dumpster.

The vet shaved Mosey as close as she possibly could. Even the top of his little head was bald and took a long time grow out. Many areas on Mosey's body couldn't be shaved, however, because his skin would have been ripped out with the fur.

For the next two weeks the foster gently pried loose the remaining mats and goo with twice daily washings and q-tips. It was tedious work, coupled with carefully applying a topical antibiotic as close to Mosey's skin as possible to help prevent infection.

Through it all, Mosey was a champ. He didn't stop purring. He knew he was being helped and couldn't show his gratitude enough. His foster remembers how he looked at her with his beautiful trusting eyes every day, never resisting her care. She still cries when she talks about Mosey. When Mosey's fur grew out, he was a gorgeous little boy. His beauty finally matched his indomitable spirit. He was joyful, happy, and full of fun.

Of course, the inevitable happened, and Mosey was adopted by someone who shared his joy and love for antics. No one could resist Mosey. We sure couldn't! His resilience touched our hearts. Happy life, Mosey. We learned so much from you!
